

Curriculum Structure at HHS

Broad General Education		
S1-2	Students take a wide range of subjects	
S3	Breadth and Depth / Personalisation and Choice: Students narrow down their subjects to 8 (plus core) But must still take a broad range across all curricular areas	

Senior Phas	e
S4	Students specialise in 6 subjects for qualifications (National 4, National 5, Skills for Work) from the 8 in S3
S5-6	Some students narrow choices down further from 6 to 5 and sit qualifications (Higher, Advanced Higher) others continue with 6 qualifications (National 4/5).

Broad General Education - S3

- ▶ S3 students will narrow down their subjects to eight, but must still take a broad range across all curricular areas.
- ► English and Mathematics and Modern Languages are compulsory, as are core entitlements of Physical Education, Faith and Philosophy and Personal and Social Education (PSD)
- In addition to this provision, learners select 6 other subjects.

The process – what happens now?

- ► Look at booklet and think about courses which interest you/you are good at or related to a specific career path.
- ▶ Discussion with parents/ carers/ Guidance Teacher/ Teachers/ Careers advisor
- Selection of subjects via interview with Guidance or SLT member

The process – what happens now?
